WHAT DOES A **PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGIST** D0?

A pediatric dermatologist cares for children – newborns through adolescents – with skin, hair, and nail disorders.

Pediatric dermatologists treat children in the outpatient clinic setting as well as care for hospitalized patients. They practice in a variety of medical settings, including children's hospitals, university medical

centers, community hospitals, and private practices. Many practitioners perform surgical procedures such as laser therapy and cutaneous surgery.



WHY SHOULD I BECOME A PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGIST?

If you enjoy caring for children of all age groups, are interested in specializing in a pediatric field, enjoy the visual aspect of medicine, prefer mainly outpatient clinic work, enjoy teaching, are facile at performing procedures, are intrigued by the variety of cutaneous findings that may signify underlying medical disorders, and wish to enjoy a healthy worklife balance, then pediatric dermatology may be the career for you!



DID YOU KNOW ALMOST **1** OUT OF **3** PEDIATRIC VISITS TYPICALLY INVOLVE A SKIN ISSUE?

The important need for pediatric dermatology is evident in extended wait times for an appointment and the growing demand for practitioners.

More physicians are also needed to accelerate research into the conditions affecting many infants and children into adulthood, from eczema to psoriasis and acne to a multitude of rare diseases.

HOW TO BECOME A PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGIST

There are many childhood skin disorders that are not seen in adults or present differently in children. A pediatric dermatologist's expertise is in their knowledge of normal growth and development of a child and when to worry. Through specialized fellowship training and subsequent pediatric dermatology board certification, pediatric dermatologists gain experience in the correct diagnosis and management of pediatric skin diseases, including proper medication management.

PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGISTS ARE MEDICAL DOCTORS WHO HAVE COMPLETED THE FOLLOWING STEPS

3-YEAR DERMATOLOGY RESIDENCY

Residents train at ACGME-accredited dermatology residency programs. At least 1 year of post-graduate training is required before starting the dermatology residency (i.e., at least 1 year in medicine, pediatrics, transitional, etc.).

PASS A **CERTIFICATION EXAM** IN GENERAL DERMATOLOGY

The American Board of Dermatology (ABD) offers a certification exam for dermatology residents in July of the year their residency concludes.

1-YEAR FELLOWSHIP

Fellowship must be completed within an ACGME-accredited pediatric dermatology fellowship program in the U.S.

PASS A **CERTIFYING EXAM** IN PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGY

Certification in general dermatology is required prior to sitting for this exam. Successful completion of a fellowship and the exam provides full board certification in pediatric dermatology. Candidates remain eligible for certification in pediatric dermatology for 5 years after completion of their fellowship.

A dermatology residency track with pediatric dermatology focus is available for board certified/eligible pediatricians. This track prepares trainees for board certification in general dermatology. Successful completion of a fellowship and the exam provides full certification in pediatric dermatology. Pediatric dermatology offers many opportunities to engage in meaningful patient care, teach, advance knowledge through cutting-edge research, volunteer for service projects, and assume leadership roles to help our field progress. Taking care of the most vulnerable patient population, children, is a pleasure and a privilege. What a joy it is to embark on a journey with a patient and their family and make personal connections over the years. Children have such resilience; I grow personally and professionally from their strength and unyielding capacity for positivity, especially among those whose skin condition is visible but they never let that stop them!

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Pediatric dermatology attracts the best and brightest physicians. Their compassion for circumstances of children with skin disease is endless, and their mentorship has made peds derm a globally recognized and critical subspecialty of dermatology. Each day I am inspired by the brilliance and humility of my colleagues and collaborators, and am motivated by our patients who put their faith in us and our communities who rely on us.

WHAT **SKIN CONDITIONS** ARE DIAGNOSED & TREATED BY PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGISTS?


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COMPENSATION

Pediatric dermatology delivers on many of the key values postgrads search for as a challenging field with significant room for growth and research. Compensation depends on the level of experience of the individual practitioner and their productivity, such as the number of patients seen and procedures performed. Salaries vary depending on geographic location but are similar to ranges of other pediatric subspecialists.





A very small and specialized field, pediatric dermatology has cultivated a tight-knit group of professionals with a constant stream of circulating information. Not to mention the rewarding feeling of helping children and establishing relationships with patients is unlike many other specialties.

Lifestyles vary on whether you work part time or full time, in a group or solo, or if you are in academics or private practice. Pediatric dermatologists usually don't have to spend the night in the hospital; however, they may be called emergently to evaluate a rash in an ill patient in the emergency room or inpatient hospital setting. Peds derms usually see a high volume of patients in the outpatient setting. If practicing in a university/academic setting, they may also be involved in clinical research and teaching of medical students, residents, and fellows.

PATIENT **PERSPECTIVES**

The SPD has created a series of more than 60 informative handouts on common skin conditions seen in children and teens called Patient Perspectives.



FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMS

The SPD has established a formal match program to coordinate the processing, distribution, and review of applicants for post-graduate pediatric dermatology training programs. The Pediatric Dermatology Fellowship Match is open to U.S. and Canadian-based residents who are board-certified or board-eligible in dermatology. Applicants are encouraged to visit individual program websites for application details and deadlines. A list of ACGME-accredited pediatric dermatology fellowship programs can be accessed on the ACGME website and via the SPD website. SPD offers a networking reception at each American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) Annual Meeting where residents can talk directly with fellowship directors and division heads about their programs.

MENTORSHIP, MEDICAL STUDENT, and UNDERREPRESENTED IN MEDICINE (URIM) MENTORSHIP AWARDS

Award recipients visit with a pediatric dermatology "mentor" for a short period of specialized training (2-4 weeks) that focuses on developing a particular expertise that isn't offered at the trainee's home institution. This experience also helps cultivate relationships between established peds derms and residents/fellows/junior faculty who choose to pursue a career in this field.

NANCY ESTERLY PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGY VISITING LECTURESHIP

Three lectureships are offered annually to support a 1-to-2-day visit from a selected pediatric dermatologist to enhance residency/faculty education in the pediatric dermatology specialty. ACGME-approved dermatology residency programs in the U.S. or programs accredited by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada are eligible to submit applications for this program.
